For students to be able to access a **range of future choices** at the end of Year 11




- Significant reform of KS4 qualifications

- Computer science: appropriate for students in maths sets 1-3






What are vocational qualifications?

- They are a level 2 qualification i.e. the equivalent of a GCSE
- They are assessed through a mix of exams and assessments (coursework)
- The curriculum in these subjects is more practical than most GCSEs
- They are <u>NOT</u> an easy option
- They are graded differently

<u>Good</u> reasons for students to choose subjects

- They enjoy the subject and will work hard
- They have found out about what they will learn in that subject in years 10-11
- They have spoken to subject teachers/older students/their tutor about the subject
- They have listened to the advice they have been given

Bad reasons to choose subjects

- They like the teacher they have in Y9 for that subject
- Their friends have chosen that subject
- They think they will like it but haven't done any research or spoken to anyone about it
- They ignore the advice they have been given

- Do some research -Talk to subject teachers/older students/ tutors to find out more about the subjects they are interested in
