- You will have assessments on **Mon, Tues, Thurs and Friday** next week
- On these days you must go to tutor time/assembly as normal and then go to the Sports Hall after this
- **Periods 3-4 are normal lessons** so bring your books and equipment for these lessons
- At the end of lunchtime, go straight to the Sports Hall when the movement bell goes
- If you take an options subject where there is no written exam (art, photography, textiles) you must go to your **normal lessons for periods 5-6** where you will be able to do revision for your upcoming assessments (make sure you bring revision materials with you)

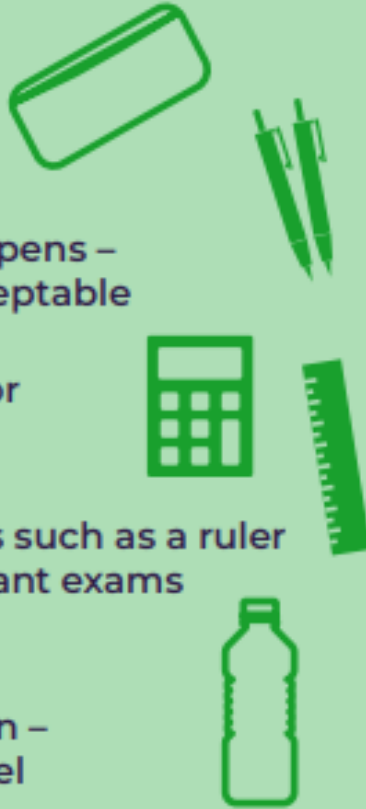
On Wednesday **Year 10 will not be in school** so you will complete your chemistry and option X assessment at a different time.

What you will need:

- a clear pencil case
- at least two black ink pens – blue pens are not acceptable
- an approved calculator for relevant exams
- appropriate apparatus such as a ruler or protractor for relevant exams
- a clear water bottle if you wish to take one in – it must not have a label



It is **your responsibility** to come with the correct equipment for every assessment



What you cannot take into exams:

- any type of phone
- revision notes
- any type of watch (this includes analogue, digital and smart watches)



The invigilators only have enough equipment to replace broken equipment, so they will not be able to lend equipment.

This is the list of Mathematical equipment you will need for your assessment.

- black pen
- pencil (for use in diagrams only)
- ruler
- pair of compasses
- protractor
- scientific calculator (we recommend this one: Casio Scientific Calculator FX-83GTBLACK)

During assessment week.....

When you go into the sports hall for each assessment you will leave your bag and coat in the **changing rooms**

You must be **in silence** from when you enter the building to when you leave at the end of each assessment

You will not be able to go back to your bag once you are in the Sports Hall so **make sure you take everything you need** for the assessment with you- it's a good idea to get this ready while you are waiting outside



During assessment week...

When you go in the Sports Hall
walk along the front on the desks, not between the rows

You must sit in your **allocated seat**
for every assessment

Seating plans will be displayed on
the outside of the Sports Hall if
you are unsure of your seat



When you are in the Sports Hall.....

Listen carefully to the invigilator's instructions . If you are unsure about anything, please raise your hand and wait for an invigilator.

Make sure you **fill in your details** on the front of answer booklet/ answer sheet as and when instructed



Ensure you have been to the toilet BEFORE your assessment.
You should not be asking to go during the assessment except in emergencies.

Ensure you fill up your water bottle BEFORE you get to the Sports Hall.
