



Pupil Premium Offer 2023-24

The information below details some of the support that can be offered to students in school. There will always be ad-hoc support given where possible, depending on each student's personal situation. This form is designed to help families be aware of some of the opportunities of support available but is by no means exhaustive.

Area of support	Level of funding support from the school	How do families access this support?
School canteen	<p>All pupils are provided with porridge free of charge at breakfast time. All students entitled to Pupil Premium funding are provided with a breakfast snack in addition to this (to the value of 65p).</p> <p>All students entitled to Pupil Premium funding are also provided with a break time snack everyday (to the value of 75p) which can be purchased before school or at break.</p> <p>Pupils who are entitled to free school meals are provided with a free break time snack everyday (to the value of 75p), as well as their allowance for a lunchtime meal of £2.45.</p>	<p>Free school meals are applied for through North Somerset local authority via: http://www.n-somerset.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals</p> <p>Families will need to reapply every school holidays.</p> <p>Families do not apply for the break time allowance, it is automatically granted to students eligible for Pupil Premium funding.</p>
School uniform	<p>All families where a student is eligible for Pupil Premium funding are automatically sent a voucher code worth £80 yearly, to support their child's uniform purchase.</p> <p>These vouchers are issued in May and valid for 12 months.</p> <p>Parents should contact Price and Buckland directly and order uniform through them.</p>	<p>All links to ordering school uniform can be found through the Backwell School webpage: http://www.backwellschool.net/School-Uniform-new</p> <p>Price and Buckland ordering: https://www.pbuniform-online.co.uk/backwellschool</p>

Residential school trips and enrichment week	Students that are eligible for Pupil Premium funding are able to claim financial support towards the overall cost of a trip. They can do this by contacting the Student Services or Finance Teams.	Families need to complete the financial assistance form which can be found at: http://www.backwellschool.net/Pupil-Premium
Music lessons	Students who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding are offered support towards music lessons (on a variety of instruments) and singing lessons. The funding usually covers half the annual costs. This can be accessed by speaking to the Head of Music.	Music lessons are organised by the Music department and letters are sent by the Departments to parents. Any additional contact with the Music department can be made through mailbox@backwellschool.net
GCSE revision materials	Students who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding are given free revision guides.	Students should speak to their individual subject teachers to access these.
Access to technology	Students without access to a laptop at home can loan one from school to help them with home learning and revision.	If your child requires this support, please contact us through mailbox@backwellschool.net
Additional academic support	Pupil Premium students are able to access small group and/or one-to-one support in English and Maths, where the school decides this is appropriate.	Maths and English organise this intervention within their respective departments. Families do not need to organise anything but are welcome to contact departments with any enquiries: mailbox@backwellschool.net
Post 16 bursary	Students entering full-time Post 16 study may be eligible for different types of financial support. There are a number of eligibility criteria's (including young people in care, disabled young people, and young people in receipt of FSM etc.) Students are encouraged to apply if they think they might qualify.
