Extended Project Qualification

Backwell Employability Award

- Certain subjects
- Externally accredited
- 40% of A level
- 11 hours a fortnight taught lessons and equivalent home learning

- Externally accredited
- 50% of A level
- 4 hours a fortnight supervised lessons + frequent lectures
- Peaks and troughs in home learning
- Significant piece of work to submit

- Internally accredited
- Not taught but directed time on timetable
- 5 elements to complete:
- ➢ online workshops
- ➢ lectures
- > work experience
- > mock interview
- ➢ presentation

The Extended Project Qualification:

- A stand alone qualification
- Equivalent in UCAS points to half an A-level marked at A2 level
- An independent and process driven piece of work
- Taught skills
 - > 1 lecture per fortnight (Week 1 Weds p5)
 - 4 hours of tutorials per fortnight (IT rooms)
- Can be completed on any topic and it can take different forms:
 - ➤ 5,000 word report
 - Artefact + minimum 1,000 word report
 - Performance + minimum 1,000 word report
- Each class will have a supervisor to **guide** them in the process

- Mock interview with employers
- 5 minute presentation what skills have you acquired and what have you learned?





Hit the ground running! organisation tips in tutor time

Plan your time and be organised

Study periods, not free periods. Do home learning early.

Think about what you would like to study at university. Think about what you want to pursue as a career.

Devote some time to developing these interests. UCAS applications are largely based on what is done this year. The EPQ could help here.

To do as well as you are capable of and to enjoy yourself along the way.



<u>Approach to study:</u> More independent and require more self-motivation. <u>Balance:</u> Studies, extra-curricular involvement and your social life.

How to achieve this?



- Take pride in your work and in the school.
- Always try to achieve your potential (both personally and academically).
- Make mistakes, but be willing to learn from constructive criticism.
- Be active members of the sixth form (both in class and independently).
- Show respect and tolerance to others and support peers.
- Be role models. (You are representing the whole sixth form and school).
- Ask for help if you are struggling academically or personally.
- Be ambitious but realistic.

Make revision material as you go along







Less than 1 hour per week	6

For every hour in the classroom, you should be spending 1 hour outside the classroom so 4-5 hours per subject each week! On average you have about 13 hours a week of study periods so this is definitely a realistic expectation.



The 16-19 Bursary Scheme

£1,200 per year in six instalments for:

- young people in care
- care leavers
- young people receiving income support
- disabled young people receiving both Employment Support Allowance and Disability Living Allowance.

£50 per month for students in receipt of free school meals AND with no unauthorised absence.

 Up to £100 (each category) of "One off" payments to cover school costs (e.g. books, travel, visits) for students with parents/carers in receipt of child tax credits. These are paid retrospectively.


