Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine for boys and girls

The HPV vaccine that protects against several types of cancer is being offered to you at school. To get the best protection, two doses are required. The second injection will be usually offered six to 24 months after the first. The school will let you know when the second dose will be given.

The HPV vaccine helps protect you against the human papillomavirus (HPV) virus, this virus increases the risk of developing some cancers later in life, such as

- Cervical cancer
- Some mouth and throat cancers
- Some cancers of the anus and genital areas

The HPV vaccine does not protect against other sexually transmitted infections



It is important for you to discuss the vaccinations with your parent/ carer, they have been sent a consent form for you to receive the vaccine.
