Dear Parent/Carer

Industrial Action

I am sure you will have seen the welcome news in relation to teachers' strikes and other forms of industrial action. The government has announced that it will follow the advice of the independent pay review board and Teachers' Unions are likely to recommend that members accept the improved pay offer.

Crucially, we have been told that the government will 'properly fund' the new pay award. This is welcome but it is not the same as saying that the pay settlement is 'fully funded'. 3% of the 6.5% pay rise will be funded by new money from government but 3.5% will come from existing school budgets. Schools will still be facing the need to cut spending significantly as a result of previous pay awards that were not fully funded as well as because of other rising costs, including energy prices.

I am optimistic, however, that this marks the end of a very difficult period of industrial dispute and disruption to children's education: I would like to thank all the Backwell School community for their understanding and support during this time.

Runwell

This year's *Runwell* programme had its finale on Wednesday. Year 7 students were inspired by the lecture from Ben Smith, who made headlines in 2015/16 by completing 401 marathons in 401 days! Students were spared the poor weather and it was uplifting to see 270 students and their tutors running for a full 20 minutes in the afternoon. It was equally pleasing to talk to some of the pupils and hear them explain the ethos behind Runwell, sharing their understanding of the importance of physical exercise for one's mental health. I would like to thank Anna Randall and her team for inventing and overseeing a thoroughly worthwhile programme. In the coming two years, these young boys and girls will add to their knowledge of techniques to support their mental health with sessions called "Breathewell' in Year 8 and "Wild and Well" in Year 9.

Sports Day and Sports Awards Evening

Our final opportunity to run Sports Day this year will be next Thursday 20 July. Before that, on the evening of Tuesday 18 July, I look forward to seeing many of you at our Sports Awards evening where we celebrate the achievements, both in and out of school, of hundreds of Backwell pupils.

Coding lessons in September 2023


Join our popular online coding club and learn to code. If you are already coding, come along and advance your coding skills.
