Year 10 - GCSE Photography: 2023-2025

The Art department aims to do its best for students by providing opportunities which will allow them to develop their abilities fully. This includes as wide a range as possible of processes and materials to work with; at Backwell, this includes a traditional chemical darkroom. Obviously, this can be very expensive to maintain and, as a result, we have to ask for a one-off payment of £20.00 per student. Some of this payment is used to purchase a kit of basic equipment that we feel all students should have as a minimum to take advantage of the facilities at Backwell.

## The basic kit will include:

- A3 plastic folder
- A3 plastic flap folder to store work
- Printing Paper
- Glue stick
- Selection of drawing pens and pencils

We have a non-profit making Art shop in the department, should students wish to purchase materials and photographic paper from us. We also keep a full range of sketchbooks ranging in price from £1.50.

In addition, during Year 10 there will be a local Photography trip, which will launch projects in the second term. The cost of last year's trip was £5.50 per student.

During the course, your child may need to borrow books, cameras and other equipment in order to work at home. We would like them to have this opportunity, but to make this possible, they need to understand what will be expected of them in terms of responsibility for that equipment. We will explain this to the students at the start of the course, but we also need you to be prepared to guarantee the safekeeping of those items during the loan period.

Any equipment which is damaged, lost or stolen will need to be paid for at the cost of replacement. Unless otherwise stated, all equipment must be returned before 9.00 am the following school day to the Art and Photography Technician, to be signed back in, to enable the equipment to be used by other students during lessons. Any equipment left unattended whilst signed out, including such items which are left in the Art department but not signed back in and then stolen, will be the responsibility of the student who borrowed them.

Throughout the course students will be expected to work safely and listen to Health and Safety instructions in lessons, particularly when introducing new processes and materials. Any student who is considered not to be respecting the safety of themselves and others will not be permitted to use those materials and tools in future lessons, which may impact on their learning. Students must not bring dangerous equipment, such as art knives, into school and lessons.

We must all be considerate of child protection and safeguarding issues and, therefore, your child must take responsibility for the appropriateness of any images that they acquire or use. Images should not include references to alcohol, drugs or smoking and the subjects must always be appropriately dressed. Teachers will discuss with students where this may be an issue and will have the final say in deciding what can or cannot be submitted to the examination board. We request that parental permission should be gained from any school age individual being used as part of a formal photoshoot set up by your child's. Your child's teacher will have a standard letter available for this.
