Dear Parents/Carers

Last week the government announced new guidance around the use of mobile phones in schools. As was widely reported, the measures suggested in the guidance are already in place in the vast majority of schools and this includes Backwell.

On this, I agree with Geoff Barton, General Secretary of ASCL, who says: "The amount of time that some children – and adults for that matter – spend on mobile phones is concerning because it can amount to addictive behaviour and is often accompanied by access to completely inappropriate and damaging material. However, this compulsive use of these devices is not something that is happening in schools – where robust polices are already in place – but while children are out of school. Most schools already forbid the use of mobile phones during the school day or allow their use only in limited and stipulated circumstances."

Nevertheless, this announcement gives an opportunity to remind parents/carers as well as pupils of our approach to the use of mobile phones in school.

Government guidance suggests that mobile phones should not be used by pupils during the school day, including at break and lunchtimes. It also suggests schools should be mindful of the risks of young people travelling to and from school without a mobile phone. Our existing policy aligns fully with these principles: students may bring a phone with them to school, but it must be switched off and in their bag for the whole of the school day. Once the bell has sounded for the end of the day, pupils can use their phones to contact home if necessary.

The government guidance suggests that less rigid rules might be appropriate for Sixth Formers, but that they should not use their mobile phones in front of younger pupils. Again, this is already part of the Backwell policy: sixth form students can use their mobile phones in the Sixth Form area, but not around the site. It is also our policy that staff should avoid using mobile devices for personal reasons in front of students.

I ask parents and carers to support us in implementing our mobile phone policy, including ensuring that any communication between home and pupil during the school day is done via the school telephone systems.

Instead, students and their parents/carers will be sent an email with a link to view the student's exam timetable. As this is a 'dynamic link' it will always display the latest timetable information. The email will be sent from *noreply@SchoolWorkSpace*, so please look out for this next week (check spam/junk folders too).

Students must view their timetable and check they know their exam dates/times and room. When the link is open there is an option to print the timetable (the school library printer is available if needed). Alternatively, you can take a screenshot of the timetable on a device for future reference.

Year 9 Vaccinations - MenACWY and Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio Vaccination

All Year 9 students are being offered booster vaccinations to fully protect them against Meningitis C and Diphtheria, Polio and Tetanus into adulthood. Sirona Healthcare, North Somerset's School Nursing team, will be in school on Tuesday 26 March 2024 to carry out these vaccinations.

Notification from North Somerset of work on the 'Festival Way' cycle path

We have been advised by North Somerset Council that work will be taking place next month to improve some of the crossings on the cycle path between Nailsea – Backwell – Flax Bourton. This may affect some of our students walking or cycling to school, as this will involve some closures of the cycle path in March, although they hope to minimise disruption by working only between 9.00 am and 3.00 pm. The affected areas are as follows:

- Backwell Bow in Backwell on Monday 25 March.
- Station Road in Flax Bourton from Tuesday 12 until Friday 15 March and on Monday 25 March.
- Lodge Lane in Nailsea from Monday 11 to Tuesday 19 March and on Monday 25 March.
- Golden Valley path in Nailsea at the crossing with Trendlewood Way between Monday 4 and Tuesday 13 March, on Monday 18 March and on Monday 25 March
