School Uniform

Over the next two weeks, we will be reinforcing with students the principles behind our uniform policy, our expectations and our procedures when correct uniform is not worn.

At Backwell we believe that uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of the school. It can instil pride; support positive behaviour and discipline and helps to ensure that all pupils feel welcome and are treated fairly.

As with all school rules, we are determined to enforce uniform rules consistently and fairly. In this, we always keep in mind the vast majority of pupils who follow uniform rules completely and who want to see the rules equally in place for others.

Please click on the following link to read about our uniform in full, <u>Backwell School - Uniform</u>. However, I will outline below some of the particular issues we are currently dealing with:

<u>Trousers</u>: As well as the school skirt, pupils have the option to wear plain black tailored trousers. In order to keep prices down, our policy means that school trousers can be bought from any supplier – but please be aware that some stores unhelpfully place inappropriate items in their 'school' sections. Please note that leggings, joggers, or any other stretchy fabrics are <u>not</u> permitted at Backwell.

<u>Jumpers and hoodies</u>: Pupils can wear the school jumper and, if they wish, a coat. However, any other jumpers or hoodies are <u>not</u> allowed. Like all uniform rules, this applies equally to travelling to and from school.

<u>Jewellery</u>: Our policy allows a watch and, if the pupil wishes, a maximum of one pair of earrings (stud or sleeper) in the ears and/or one stud in the nose. These must be removed for PE/Sports activities. No other facial piercings, spacer-style, 'dangly' or spiked earrings are allowed. No necklaces, rings, or bracelets. Students will be asked to remove any form of jewellery that is not allowed.

Please can we ask parents and carers to re-familiarise themselves with the Backwell uniform code and support us? We are timing this 'push' on uniform to allow families time over the Easter holidays to purchase or find garments if necessary.
